

## BLACK IN MARINE SCIENCE HOSTS "LITTY HOUR" AT THE HISTORIC VIRGINIA KEY BEACH PARK TO HONOR THE LIBERATION OF OUR ANCESTORS ON JUNETEENTH.

Miami, Florida. – Litty Hour celebrates storytelling and environmental justice in Black coastal communities. At the Historic Virginia Key Beach Park on June 19, Black In Marine Science (BIMS), Ocean Conservancy, Large-Scale CoPe: Strongs Coasts, and BlueGAP, will host an exclusive screening featuring documentaries, Harm in the Water and A Splash of Color, and shorts, including BIMS Bite, Mangroves in Belize. The event will bring together current and future leaders in ocean, coastal, and climate science research and individuals who incorporate storytelling into their science to raise awareness and promote community justice. Documentary filmmakers have collaborated with scientists and community leaders to share stories about the work of these champions in dynamic films funded by BlueGAP, a National Science Foundation Blue Economy Convergence Accelerator project. During the event, guests can eat, drink, and mingle while meeting with community leaders, scientists, and climate and environmental justice advocates. After the screening, there will be a Blue Table Talk panel discussion featuring filmmakers and special guests. Lastly, the evening will conclude with dancing and joy as we celebrate the liberation of our ancestors on Juneteenth.
